YIC Radiographer Lead,
Head of Profession,

She began plain film reporting in 2004 and became one of the first chest reporting radiographers in West Yorkshire. She is also the clinical lead for the DXA service at Mid Yorkshire and implemented a radiographer DXA reporting service 2010.
